Quality education in emergencies

Together with the Education Cannot Wait fund and research and innovation partners, we integrate evidence based MHPSS into emergency education programs, and ensure strong links exist between education, protection, and health services for all children.

Migration and displacement

In today's world, unprecedented numbers of children and families are displaced or on the move due to conflict, violence, and environmental disasters. We work to understand the challenges they face across the migration journey, and to link them with critical MHPSS and community care across borders through innovative partnerships.

Climate change

The pervasive and growing effects of natural hazards and climate change have huge impacts for children and families, particularly in fragile settings. As climate change shapes their world and future, we give young people a platform to be heard, and to research and innovate solutions for community action.
