Dr Idit Albert is a Consultant Clinical Psychologist at the Centre for Anxiety Disorders and Trauma, specialising in the treatment of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder. She will be presenting the work of the psychological support service for UK medics who volunteered in the Ebola treatment centres in Sierra Leone. She contributed to an international workbook for health care professionals working with survivors of human trafficking. Idit also developed a service providing outreach psychological support to military veterans in Bosnia Herzegovina. Recently, she led a service for UK survivors of recent international terrorist attacks. Idit has extensive

clinical experience of treating refugees and survivors of human trafficking that arrived to the UK from a variety of countries.
